Alan Boon Cup

CHESHUNT produced the shock of the day in the second round of the Alan Boon Cup on Tuesday. Lying 16th in Division One North, and fresh from an 8-1 home defeat on Saturday, they deservedly beat Premier Division leaders Hornchurch 3-1.

Josh Hutchinson's early header for the hosts was quickly answered by Tambeson Eyong, but once Kevin Ashwood restored Cheshunt's lead nine minutes before half-time they rarely looked like being caught again.

A straight red card for Dave Collis three minutes after the interval was a further blow to Urchins and a late goal by Jordan Williams made sure for Cheshunt.

Ramsgate pulled off the other major upset as they romped to a 4-0 victory at Premier high-fliers Cray. Pascal Ebigbo gave the Division One South club the lead and two Steve O'Brien goals in seven minutes of playing time either side of the interval put them in command. Joe Taylor added the fourth.

Two other Premier sides went out to Division One opposition. A second-minute goal by Lea Dawson gave Thamesmead a 1-0 home win over Wingate but it was far more dramatic at Concord, where Needham Market came out on top after goalie Andrew Plummer headed a last-gasp equaliser.

Jose Espinosa gave the Marketmen the lead but Tony Stokes, Harry Elmes and the splendidlynamed Jean-Phillippe Yamfam gave the Premier side a 3-1 advantage.

Only two minutes were left when Sam Newson claimed his 17th goal of the season for Needham and Plummer then got on the end of a set piece to make it 3-3.

A new rule this season means that drawn games go straight to penalties without extra time being played and Needham won 3-1. It was the same story at Lowestoft, though here the late rally prevented an upset.

Harry Cook and Emiel Aiken fired Tilbury into a 2-0 lead before Joe Clark gave Lowestoft hope with a minute left and Stuart Ainsley squared it. The hosts then won the shoot-out 3-1.

Two other games went to penalties after last-gasp equalisers. Tony Russell's 90th-minute goal for Aveley gave them a 1-1 draw at Canvey, who had gone ahead through Jason Hallett a minute before the interval. Russell's effort was in vain as the Islanders won the shoot-out 4-2.

There was more luck for Maldon's Billy Burgess in their delayed first-round tie at Great Wakering.

He scored a 90th-minute goal to snatch a 2-2 draw and his side then won the shoot-out. A James Lawson penalty had given Maldon the lead but Billy Johnson's second-half double almost saw Wakering through.

A Richard Jolly double could not save Wealdstone from exiting on penalties at Leatherhead, again after a 2-2 draw. Tanners took the lead in each half through Kev Terry and Greg Andrews.

Two other ties went to spot-kicks, both domestic Division One South affairs. Corinthian-Casuals beat Hythe 5-4 after a 1-1 draw.

Hythe had gone ahead in the first half with a Dave Cook penalty and Joel Thompson levelled matters with 20 minutes to go.

It was goalless after 90 minutes at Whitstable and Chipstead won the shoot-out 5-3.

Top scorers of the night were Bognor. Terry Dodd and Lewis Ide scored in the last five minutes of the first half at Walton Casuals and Rocks went on to win 5-0 with a couple from James Crane and one from Jack Blatchford.

It was Neil Shipperley's last game in charge of Casuals. He resigned on Monday after 15 months

at the helm but stayed on the bench for Tuesday's game.

Sussex rivals Lewes settled for a 4-0 win at Crawley Down. Paul Booth and Jamie Cade netted in the first half, Ian Draycott and Max Noble in the second.

Two first-half goals by Adam Marsh and two after the break by Kes Metitiri eased Chatham to a 4-1 home victory over Ilford, for whom Leon Smith was on target when they were three down.

Dulwich went through by the same margin at home to Burgess Hill. Nyren Clunis, Junior Kadi, with a penalty, and Peter Adeniyi put them 3-0 up before Pat Harding replied. Dean Carpenter claimed Dulwich's fourth.

A burst of three Carshalton goals in six minutes denied Worthing a possible upset.

Rebels held on to Ryan McBride's early goal until the 62nd minute, when Billy Crook put the visitors on level terms.

David Ray rapidly added two more and Robins won 3-1.

Goals in the first 11 minutes by Jordan Lang and Nick Fogden set up Eastbourne's 3-0 success at Faversham. Lang scored again on the hour.

Waltham Abbey fell behind to Gareth Heath's early penalty at Leiston, who also finished 3-0 up thanks to Rhys Henry and a second from Heath.

It was a clean sweep for the league's five Suffolk clubs.

Keiron Leabon struck on the half-hour to give Bury a 1-0 home win over Harlow and James Baker scored the only goal of the night nine minutes from time to see Sudbury through at Heybridge.

Lee Flynn put Division One North leaders Grays ahead at Billericay but the hosts, second in the Premier, equalised five minutes before half-time through Chris Wild and clinched a 2-1 victory with a 73rd-minute strike by Jay May.

James Parker gave Hendon an early lead at Harrow and they held it until the 75th minute. Then quickfire goals by Evandro Delgado and Jon-Jo Bates saw Harrow through 2-1.

Margate beat Kingstonian 3-1, all the goals coming in the first half.

Margate were three up in 35 minutes through Adam Burchell, Dean Grant and Dean Pooley, with Ian Gayle replying just before the interval.

Hastings scored in the first and last minutes of the second half as they went through 2-0 at Sittingbourne. Kenny Pogue and Aaron Parris were the marksmen.

There were 2-0 away wins, too, for Met Police and Walton & Hersham.

Staforde Palmer gave the Met a first-half lead at Whitehawk with Matt Cefai adding a late second.

Kenny Ojukwu's 21st minute goal for Walton at Whyteleafe looked like completing the scoring until Freddie Fleming put through his own net in added time.

A Ryan Mattos strike on the hour accounted for visiting Potters Bar and gave Ware, who are bottom of Division One North, something to cheer.

Four more ties were played on Wednesday and it turned out to be a night for home teams, who won all four games by an aggregate of 17-1.

Maidstone have enjoyed a few cup romps this season and they did it again, hitting six unanswered goals against Merstham.

Alex Waugh led the way with a hat-trick, two of them in the first half. Danny Lye and Alex Flisher made it 4-0 at the interval and Tom Mills completed the rout after Waugh netted his third.

Folkestone had to settle for 5-0 – but they were facing Premier Division opposition in Horsham.

James Everitt gave the Division One club an early lead and Darren Smith added a penalty before the interval. Josh Burchell, Everitt and Cade Mortimer finished it off

Two superb late goals gave Enfield Town a 3-0 victory over Waltham Forest. It was a harsh scoreline for the visitors, who held their own in a lively affair after Jay Siva opened the scoring in the 11th minute.

Liam Hope's perfect free-kick in the 88th minute clinched victory and Daniel Ailey wrapped it up with a vicious shot from the tightest of angles.

Croydon Athletic were the only visiting side to score. Connor French netted after 71 minutes to give his side a chance at Tooting, who were two up at half-time through Wade Small and Osa Obamwonyi. Jamie Byatt's 80th-minute penalty made it 3-1 to the Terrors.
